Vendors are informed that the above subject solicitation is hereby modified, corrected, or supplemented as specified, described and set forth in this Addendum:

I. DUE DATE

The due date is extended; responses must be submitted via DemandStar no later than 2:30 PM on Wednesday, May 12, 2021.

II. NON-MANDATORY SITE VISIT

A Non-Mandatory Site Visit will be conducted at 10:00 AM on Friday, May 7, 2021. Vendors shall convene in the lobby area of the Muscogee County Prison, which is located at 7175 Sacerdote Lane, Columbus, GA 31907. The purpose of the site visit is to allow vendors to view the specified doors at Muscogee County Prison.

- A. For security purposes, all attendees will be required to submit a valid picture I.D.
- B. Attendees will be required to wear face masks and observe social distancing.
- C. A maximum of two (2) representatives, from each company, will be allowed to attend the site visit.
- D. Each attendee must sign an attendance sheet, complete with the name of the company, name of attendee, complete address, and contact information.
- E. Questions/concerns resulting from the Site Visit must be submitted in writing to the Purchasing Division, as specified on pages 9, 10 and 18 of the RFB.
- F. Use the form on page 2 of this addendum to confirm your intent to attend the site visit.

III. OUESTIONS/RESPONSES

Question 1: Who currently provides the maintenance services for the prison and how long have

they been providing those services?

Response: In April 2013, a 5-year contract was awarded to Unique Security, Inc.

(Montgomery, AL). In May 2016, a 5-year contract was awarded to

AdaptToSolve, Inc. (LaGrange, GA).

Question 2: Are all of the doors freely swinging and the locks, DPS's, door closers currently

operating and indicating (secure/unsecure) correctly on the control(s)?

Response: Yes.

Question 3: Throughout the RFB, it seems that the desire is to have PM services for the

detention doors and hardware. However, on page 15 of 35 of the RFB – Technical Specifications Section IV, Preventive Maintenance, Item A states that PM services is to also include "electronic and control systems". We believe this to be the only mention of the control system in the RFB. Will additional information be provided regarding the existing control system (i.e., how old the system is, who the original integration firm was and what type of control system (PLC's, proprietary or

customized relay logic boards, hard wired relay system, etc.)?

Response: The system was installed in 2008 and is a hard-wired stand-alone board. The

control system mentioned is the panels located in the control rooms that operates the opening and closing of the doors. Additional photos of the inside of the main panel are attached. There are a total of four panels that operate

different sectors of the prison.

Question 4: The control panel picture included in the RFB (Attachment A) shows a hard

graphic panel with surface mounted pushbuttons. Is this the only control panel?

Response: There are four such panels. Each panel operates a different section of the

prison.

Question 5: If there are multiple control panels, are they also hard graphic panels and are they

currently networked to a central control station or are they all stand-alone systems?

Response: See above responses to Questions 3 and 4.

Question 6: Are there any control system drawings that can be reviewed by the potential

bidders?

Response: Drawings are not available.

Question 7: Is the existing control system integrated with any other subsystems (CCTV camera

and recording system, Intercom/paging system, Duress (or man-down) system, perimeter detection system, etc.)? If there are, can you provide the manufacturer of

each subsystem along with the quantities of each subsystem field devices (cameras, intercom stations, master intercom stations, duress receivers &

transmitters, paging zones & quantity of paging speakers, perimeter zones, etc.?

Response: There is an intercom station that can transmit and receive communication

from the two (2) dorms. Only two (2) panels have this feature. Refer to the

attached photos for additional information.

Question 8: Page 15 of 35, IV Preventive Maintenance, Item A requires two visits per year to

perform PM services. Are these visits to be invoiced based on the unit pricing required on the Bid Form (Pricing Page)? We normally see required pricing for each PM site visit with a fixed price based on a desired number of hours per visit. The unit pricing requested on the Bid Form would normally be provided and used for extra service calls outside the two semiannual visits and/or emergency service

calls.

Response: Refer to the Revised Bid Form (Pricing Page), which shall be used to submit

pricing.

Question 9: Will the prison provide security escorts for the technicians during PM Service

trips?

Response: Yes.
