Project Description

<u>Transportation Enhancement Eligibility</u> – The City proposes to make improvements along 14th Street between 9th Avenue and 12th Avenue. The improvements will include correcting some ADA deficiencies such as sidewalks, ramps and cross walks, creation of a bicycle lane, hardscape improvements, and limited landscaping.

Relationship To Transportation – The proposed project is located in the heart of the City's Downtown area. The City is presently working to improve the entire downtown area to make it more pedestrian friendly allowing easy access to Troy University, the Marriott Hotel, the Parking Garage, the Riverwalk, the 14th Street Pedestrian Bridge and any future developments. In addition to pedestrian activity the City is working to provide bicycle routing through our downtown area via 14th Street connecting through to Columbus. This proposed project is a second phase of a current project that provides pedestrian and bicycle access along 14th Street.

<u>History</u> – Although nothing is listed on the historic registry, the downtown is located in an area rich with history. Remnants of the Eagle and Phenix Dam and Cotton Mill are located along the Riverwalk south of the 13th Street bridge. The "Battle of Girard", the last major engagement of the Civil War, occurred along the present day 14th Street area on April 16, 1865. In an alley off of 5th Avenue, the Democratic nominee for Alabama Attorney General, Albert Love Patterson, was murdered causing a declaration of martial law by General Walter J. "Crack" Hanna with the Alabama National Guard coming to Phenix City in 1954. The current Russell County Courthouse is located along 14th Street and a historic building converted from a post office built in 1938 to the Phenix City/Russell County Library and is a possible location for a museum. The majority of the downtown area contains buildings from this era that are now being utilized as commercial and office space.

<u>Scenic Significance</u> – The City's downtown area overlooks the Chattahoochee River at a very scenic location and offers a vantage point for the Chattahoochee River Whitewater Course and an impressive view of the Columbus Riverfront.

<u>Impact</u> – The proposed project will provide community enhancements that will significantly improve the accessibility and usability and of the existing pedestrian facilities in the downtown area. The City is committed to working to improve access to community amenities by adding and improving sidewalks for the entire downtown area. The City intends for the downtown area to be heavily traveled by pedestrians to and from local restaurants, grocery stores, riverfront activities, Troy University, Russell County Courthouse, and the City Riverwalk. The proposed project is the continuation of a phased construction approach to improve pedestrian facilities along 14th Street from 9th Avenue to 12th Avenue. The project promotes mobility and meets the needs of non-motorized users.

Due to the close proximity of the project to Frederick Douglas Homes, a low-income affordable housing community, the proposed project will serve as a benefit to the Environmental Justice community. The community will be provided safer and better access to and from community services and employment in the downtown area.

<u>Proposed Construction</u> - The proposed project along 14th Street from 9th Avenue to 12th Avenue will include the following ADA compliant improvements:

• Remove ADA deficient sidewalks on the north and south sides of 14th Street.

- Provide 5' wide ADA compliant sidewalks with intermittent brick pavers on the north and south sides of 14th Street similar to the completed sidewalk between Broad Street and 5th Avenue. (See first photograph in Appendix E).
- Install ADA compliant curb ramps with detectable warning surfaces at all intersection crosswalks and other locations as appropriate.
- Adjust driveway crossings to be accessible and ADA compliant.
- Provide pedestrian crosswalk striping and markings at all intersections.
- Provide bike lane striping and markings.
- Provide pedestrian lighting on both sides of the street.
- Perform some minor utility adjustments to reset valve boxes, water meters and manhole covers.

<u>Ownership</u> - All of the proposed construction will be performed inside of the City's Rights of Way.

<u>Intended Use</u> – The improvements are intended for public use. The project will serve to improve the intersections of existing pedestrian facilities in the downtown area, making them ADA compliant, safer, and easier to travel.

Life Expectancy – The life expectancy of this project is 20 years.

Maintenance Plan – The City's Public Works Department will perform maintenance as required to include grass and landscape upkeep, sidewalk repair as needed, replacement of tactile warnings as needed, general lighting maintenance and any other associated repairs as damages occur. The City's Public Works Department should be able to provide any maintenance in-house for a labor and materials cost of approximately \$1,000 per year.

WHEREAS, the Governors of Georgia and Alabama have designated the Columbus Department of Planning as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the Columbus-Phenix City (C-PCTS) urban area; and

WHEREAS, the City of Phenix City, Alabama has applied for and been approved by the MPO Committees to receive funding from the MPO allocated TAP funds; and








ATTACHMENT D Project Area Map
